

CURRENT PROJECTS

31 Rochester St. Ottawa.

Community gardens are a place that gives our community an opportunity to grow food and connect with nature.

Our current project is developing the plot on 31 Rochester. We hope to do this with partners like CCOC, SWCHC and the Ottawa Community Land Trust.

This would add to our existing DCA gardens (Preston & Somerset, Plant Rec. Centre, 755 Somerset) as well as the "guerrilla gardening" done by volunteers on our streets.
